12 Jan. - Zoology Landscape Committee (ZLC) met with Landscape Architecture to review class designs

16 Jan. - ZLC met to discuss next step. Decided to go with ~~the~~ student design team suggested by L.A.

  - When we first offered the students this job / contract, each of them was told what was involved & asked if they had the time to do it. They all answered yes.
  - We were very pleased with the model they gave us. All that was left to do was the drawing.
